**FIRST ENGROSSMENT
with Conference Committee Amendments**

ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1020

Introduced by

Appropriations Committee

(At the request of the Governor)

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the extension
2 service, northern crops institute, upper great plains transportation institute, main research
3 center, branch research centers, and agronomy seed farm; to amend and reenact sections
4 4-41-02 and 24-02-03.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to industrial hemp licenses
5 and the central motor pool; to provide for transfer of funds; to provide legislative intent; to
6 provide for a report to the sixty-first legislative assembly; to provide an exemption; and to
7 declare an emergency.

8 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

9 **SECTION 1. BASE LEVEL FUNDING INFORMATION.** The amounts identified in this
10 section represent the base level funding component appropriated to the North Dakota state
11 university extension service, the northern crops institute, the upper great plains transportation
12 institute, the main research center, branch research centers, and agronomy seed farm in
13 section 3 of this Act as follows:

19 **SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the
20 funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
21 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and
22 other income, to the North Dakota state university extension service, the northern crops
23 institute, the upper great plains transportation institute, the main research center, branch
24 research centers, and agronomy seed farm for the purpose of defraying the expenses of those
25 agencies, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, as follows:

6 **SECTION 4. ADDITIONAL INCOME - APPROPRIATION.** In addition to the amount
7 included in the grand total special funds appropriation line item in section 3 of this Act, any
8 other income, including funds from federal acts, private grants, gifts, and donations, or from
9 other sources received by the North Dakota state university extension service, the northern
10 crops institute, the upper great plains transportation institute, the main research center, branch
11 research centers, and agronomy seed farm, except as otherwise provided by law, is
12 appropriated for the purpose designated in the act, grant, gift, or donation, for the biennium
13 beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.

14 **SECTION 5. TRANSFER AUTHORITY.** Upon approval of the state board of
15 agricultural research and education and appropriate branch research center directors, the
16 director of the main research center may transfer appropriation authority within subdivisions 1,
17 2, 4, and 5 of section 3 of this Act and shall notify the office of management and budget within
18 ten days following the transfer.

19 **SECTION 6. FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT POSITION ADJUSTMENTS.** The board of
20 higher education is authorized to adjust or increase full-time equivalent positions as needed for
21 the entities in section 3 of this Act, subject to availability of funds. The board shall report any
22 adjustments to the office of management and budget prior to the submission of the 2009-11
23 budget request.

24 **SECTION 7. AMENDMENT.** Section 4-41-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
25 amended and reenacted as follows:

26 **4-41-02. Industrial hemp - Licensure - Reporting requirements - Continuing**
27 **appropriation.**

28 1. Any person desiring to grow industrial hemp for commercial purposes shall apply
29 to the agriculture commissioner for a license on a form prescribed by the
30 commissioner. The application for a license must include the name and address of
31 the applicant and the legal description of the land area to be used to produce

1 industrial hemp. Except for employees of the agricultural experiment station or the
2 North Dakota state university extension service involved in research and extension
3 related activities, the commissioner shall require each applicant for initial licensure
4 to submit to a statewide and nationwide criminal history check. The nationwide
5 criminal history check must be conducted in the manner provided in section
6 12-60-24. All costs associated with the background check are the responsibility of
7 the applicant. Criminal history records provided to the commissioner under this
8 section are confidential. The commissioner may use the records only in
9 determining an applicant's eligibility for licensure. Any person with a prior criminal
10 conviction is not eligible for licensure. If the applicant has completed the
11 application process to the satisfaction of the commissioner, the commissioner shall
12 issue the license, which is valid for a period of one year. Any person licensed
13 under this section is presumed to be growing industrial hemp for commercial
14 purposes. A license required by this section is not conditioned on or subject to
15 review or approval by the United States drug enforcement agency.

16 2. Each licensee must file with the commissioner documentation indicating that the
17 seeds planted were of a type and variety certified to have no more than
18 three-tenths of one percent tetrahydrocannabinol and a copy of any contract to
19 grow industrial hemp. Each licensee shall notify the commissioner of the sale or
20 distribution of any industrial hemp grown by the licensee, and the names of the
21 persons to whom the hemp was sold or distributed.

22 3. The commissioner shall adopt rules to allow the industrial hemp to be tested during
23 growth for tetrahydrocannabinol levels and to allow for supervision of the industrial
24 hemp during its growth and harvest. To provide sufficient funds to pay costs
25 associated with monitoring and testing industrial hemp in the state, the
26 commissioner shall assess each applicant a fee of five dollars per acre. The
27 minimum fee assessed must be one hundred fifty dollars per applicant.
28 Collections from this fee must be deposited in the attorney general's operating fund
29 and are hereby appropriated to the attorney general to be used to enforce this
30 chapter.

1 **SECTION 8. AMENDMENT.** Section 24-02-03.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is
2 amended and reenacted as follows:

3 **24-02-03.3. Central management system for all state-owned licensed motor**
4 **vehicles.**

- 5 1. The director shall establish within the department a central vehicle management
6 system to regulate the operation, maintenance, and management of all motor
7 vehicles owned or leased by the state subject to registration under chapters 39-04
8 and 39-05. Upon the request of a state agency and an agreement between the
9 agency and director for the use of the motor vehicle-related equipment, the director
10 may purchase or lease motor vehicle-related equipment and include that
11 equipment within the system. The director shall provide a uniform method of
12 documenting the use and cost of operation of motor vehicles and motor
13 vehicle-related equipment in the system. The director shall advise the director of
14 the office of management and budget as to the need to acquire or dispose of
15 system motor vehicles. The specifications for highway patrol vehicles to be
16 acquired may be set by the highway patrol superintendent. Every state agency,
17 institution, department, board, bureau, and commission unless exempted by the
18 director must use the system. At the request of the director of the North Dakota
19 agricultural experiment station, certain vehicles used in farming operations at the
20 agronomy seed farm and branch research centers shall be exempt from the
21 requirements of this section. However, an agency, institution, department, board,
22 bureau, or commission may authorize the use of an employee's personal motor
23 vehicle pursuant to subsection 4 of section 54-06-09.
- 24 2. The director may enter into an agreement with a state employee who has a
25 disability requiring a specially-equipped vehicle to pay a mileage rate greater than
26 the rate established in section 54-06-09 for the employee's use of the employee's
27 specially-equipped motor vehicle while conducting state business. The rate must
28 be based on the rate provided in section 54-06-09, increased by the actual cost
29 per mile caused by the special equipment, and may not exceed the cost
30 associated with the special equipment expressed as the new value plus the

1 depreciated fair market value in eight years divided by two, divided by twenty
2 thousand miles.

3 3. Each entity required to use the system shall submit records of the operation of
4 each vehicle as directed by the director.

5 **SECTION 9. UNEXPENDED GENERAL FUND - EXCESS INCOME.** Any unexpended
6 general fund appropriation authority to and any excess income received by entities listed in
7 section 3 of this Act are not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11, and any
8 unexpended funds from these appropriations or revenues are available and may be expended
9 by those entities, during the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.

10 **SECTION 10. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - BEEF RESEARCH FACILITY.** It is the intent
11 of the sixtieth legislative assembly that before proceeding with a beef research facility, a
12 documented agreement as to the location of the facility must be provided to the main research
13 center from applicable city and county government officials.

14 **SECTION 11. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - OPERATING POOL FUNDING.** It is the intent
15 of the sixtieth legislative assembly that the appropriation from the permanent oil tax trust fund
16 as provided in subdivision 4 of section 3 of this Act is to be available only for providing funding
17 for operations of the Dickinson research center and the amount provided is to be limited to the
18 lesser of \$750,000 or the amount actual oil revenues are less than budgeted for the research
19 center for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.

20 **SECTION 12. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - USE OF LIVESTOCK FACILITIES.** It is the
21 intent of the sixtieth legislative assembly that the agricultural experiment station consider
22 options to ensure that the use of the livestock facilities at Dickinson, Hettinger, Carrington, and
23 Streeter are being maximized.

24 **SECTION 13. NATIONAL CATTLEMEN'S BEEF ASSOCIATION FUNDING -**
25 **REPORT TO SIXTY-FIRST LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.** The agricultural experiment station
26 shall provide a report to the sixty-first legislative assembly regarding the funding received
27 during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, from the national
28 cattlemen's beef association.

29 **SECTION 14. EXEMPTION.** The amounts appropriated for the research greenhouse
30 complex project, as contained in subdivision 4 of section 3 of chapter 48 of the 2005 Session
31 Laws and for the north central research center laboratory and greenhouse project, as contained

1 in subdivision 5 of section 3 of chapter 48 of the 2005 Session Laws are not subject to the
2 provisions of section 54-44.1-11, and any unexpended funds from these appropriations or
3 related revenues are available and may be expended during the biennium beginning July 1,
4 2007, and ending June 30, 2009. The main research center may use any funding available
5 within the total appropriation authority for the main research center greenhouse project to begin
6 construction of the greenhouses.

7 **SECTION 15. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO**
8 **SIXTY-FIRST LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.** The total appropriation in section 3 of this Act
9 includes \$8,732,750 from the general fund and \$750,000 from the permanent oil tax trust fund
10 for the one-time funding items identified in this section. This amount is not a part of the
11 agency's base budget to be used in preparing the 2009-11 executive budget. The agricultural
12 experiment station shall report to the appropriations committees of the sixty-first legislative
13 assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and
14 ending June 30, 2009.

25 **SECTION 16. EMERGENCY.** The appropriation for capital projects of \$5,500,000 in
26 subdivision 3 of section 3, \$7,907,750 in subdivision 4 of section 3, and \$1,101,000 in
27 subdivision 5 of section 3 and section 7 of this Act are declared to be an emergency measure.
